Step 1: Patient identification

> Search your clinic's medical records to identify three patients with risk factors for stroke for example, patients with atrial fibrillation, diabetes, hypertension, dyslipidaemia, smoker Alternatively, the following steps can be applied to the next three patients that visit the clinic who have risk factors for stroke.

Step 2: Review of stroke risk factor management

- > Assess absolute CV risk for this patient
- > Review current management against best practice guidelines

Step 3: Recall the patient

> Systematically assess current CV risk factors and optimise management based on best practice guidelines

Step 4: Provide patient education

- > For the three patients you have identified as at risk for stroke, ask them to:
 - Describe symptoms of a heart attack, and what they would do if they (or someone they know), experienced them
 - Describe symptoms of a stroke, and what they would do if they (or someone they know), experienced them
- > Review the signs and symptoms of stroke and the need to act F.A.S.T.

Step 5: Review systems and protocols in your practice for stroke prevention and management

- > Review systems and protocols in your practice for identifying and managing patients at risk of stroke and update these where appropriate
- > Ensure all staff are aware of the signs and symptoms of stroke and the need to act F.A.S.T.





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
